### **Financials**

> our long time Security Patrol Officer. Perkin LaCour, decided to retire. There was a push by some residents for the Knollwood Village Civic Club (KVCC) to donate club funds as a retirement gift and or hire Perkin on a limited basis to have him perform a knowledge transfer of his experiences and observations into a historical document for reference purposes. Our attorney recommended that we not use club funds for a donation to an individual and the KVCC saw limited value in the documentation. I want to let everyone know that the board considered both options and decided to table it. For some background, current and former board members of the KVCC have organized annual holiday fundraisers that on average totaled \$5K or more since 2014 totaling ~\$30K in additional revenue for Perkin and his family. That includes for his retirement where he received \$5,620. In each fundraiser, the club

ensured Perkin received 100% of the donations. We reached out to Perkin in August to give him a final check for some late arriving donations. He wanted us to share that he misses the neighborhood, that he is thankful for the generous homeowners, and he is enjoying retirement.

### NRG Park - Yellow Lot Concerts

We were able to recently renew our contract with SMG/NRG Park, which is good news. This agreement basically says NRG Park will continue to make specific concessions for concerts held in the NRG Park Yellow Lots in an effort to reduce the music volume coming in the direction of our neighborhood. Additionally, they will provide an officer to patrol the neighborhood and have someone periodically checking the noise levels to ensure they are within the permitted Some new language was limits. added to the contract so rather than sign a new 3-year contract they want to see how the next year goes before considering a longer-term agreement. We will revisit this again next summer. Going forward, NRG said they would re-direct any complaints they receive back to the Civic Club so I would encourage residents to let us know of your concerns or questions and we will do our best to provide you with a response. As of the printing of this newsletter, NRG does not currently have any yellow lot concerts scheduled the rest of this year but they are working on some preliminary events that may get scheduled in 2019. As soon as we know, we will share with the neighborhood via email and Nextdoor.com.

# Architectural Control Committee (ACC) Dating back to April, the ACC has been busy working with a homeowner

who wants to build what we know the City of Houston (COH) will consider to be a three-story home. Most of our section's Deed Restrictions (DR) today limit homes to only two stories. The process is complicated due to the style of the home, the new COH Flood Elevation requirements, and a guideline document that we created many years ago to help homeowners and home builders align themselves with the ACC on a definition of a story. The ACC, at least for the time being, prefers to preserve the DR 2 story requirement. They believe it's too drastic of a change to create a guideline to allow a three story home--which is the direction some other neighborhoods in the area have recently been going. Another option for residents is to coordinate the formal process of proposing change(s) to a deed restriction which requires getting 51% of the residents in that section to approve.

While the ACC continues to work through this process, the ACC is close to publishing an update to the previous multi-story guideline document. If you are a homeowner considering building a new home, the ACC recommends that you get familiar with our updated multi-story guideline document to help ensure your design will be in compliance before you begin designing your new home. The document will be posted on our website at knollwoodvillage. org under the Build | ACC FAQs section. We will also publish it in the next newsletter for your convenience.

### **VOLUNTEERS!**

Special thanks to the Social committee for organizing the Astros Night Out for the neighborhood for the second year in a row. We had over 40 residents attend! The Social committee is now focusing on National Night Out which is coming soon – Tuesday, October 1st. Please look for information in this newsletter and please reach out if you are

interested in hosting your block on October 1. This is an excellent event and a great way to meet or catch up with new and familiar families and friends in the neighborhood.

Looking ahead, we will need a new Secretary on our board for next year. If you are looking to be a part of a well-organized neighborhood group and you want to have a vote on important things in your community, please reach out to us. We would be happy invite you to observe meetings, etc. to give you more insight without any obligation.

Additionally, we could use some help organizing our newsletter. In this role, you will help collect articles from resources, write and proof articles, and work with a vendor to publish, print and distribute the newsletter. It's a quarterly effort.

Looking ahead even further, once we get into 2020, we will be looking for new leaders as President, Vice President and Treasurer for 2021. Getting involved now with limited expectations is a way to test the waters. We have all types of homeowners on our board. Many are parents with little ones such as myself (two boys, ages 5 and 7), several have kids in high school, and some are retired. 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### **KVCC Summer 2019 Incident Report**

The Knollwood Village security incidents reported below are compiled from reports that residents make to Smith Security, data available on the Houston Police Department's crime statistics website, and any reports from residents to security@knollwoodvillage.org. Information available on the HPD's website is limited to the very basic details of block number, date, time, and type of crime.

Since the last Knollwood Village newsletter incidents that have been reported include four thefts from vehicles and two habitation burglaries. These incidents were reported to HPD, but not to Smith Security. Please report all criminal incidents to both HPD and Smith. HPD allocates their patrol resources to areas that report incidents so it is to Knollwood Village's benefit to report all incidents that occur here to HPD.

After reporting an incident to the Houston Police Department, PLEASE call Smith Security and give a report to them, as well. The reports provide important details to Smith so they know what to be on the lookout for. Also, providing information from Smith about neighborhood crime in this newsletter helps keep residents informed about how the criminals operate so deterrent measures can be made more effective.

If you notice any persons in the neighborhood who are behaving suspiciously please IMMEDIATELY call the Houston Police Department's non-emergency phone number, which is 713-884-3131, and report them. After you report the suspicious person(s) to HPD, please call Smith Protective Services at 713-789-5944, and report the suspicious person(s) to them. It is important to call HPD and Smith because they both need to know what to watch out for.

However, you see a crime in progress, such as a person breaking the window of a house or kicking in a door, then call 911, the City of Houston's emergency number, to report it.

Knollwood Village is in Precinct 7 of the Harris County Constable's office. The patrol dispatch number for the Precinct 7 Constable's office is 713-643-6602. The Houston Police Department should always be called first at their non-emergency number listed above, but feel free to call the Precinct 7 Constable's dispatch number second. If a Constable officer happens to be patrolling in the area they may be able to respond to a call more quickly than HPD officers patrolling further away.

### BSN stands for Braeswood Super Neighborhood Update

### **Bridges:**

I am sure by now everyone is aware that work has begun on the extension of the bridges at Stella Link and Braeswood, both the North and Southbound lanes. The contractor is working on several bridges simultaneously. We had a slight shut-down on work this past month due to a bird's nest and rules regarding what can and cannot be done that might disturb the eggs in the nest. As of the last week in August, work has resumed on the extension. Work is scheduled for completion in about 6 months. After Stella Link is completed, the contractor will move to Buffalo Speedway. This will be a total demolition of the existing structure and installation of a new bridge. Traffic will be diverted to Stella Link and Kirby during construction. Currently there is utility work underway at Buffalo Speedway that is causing some intermittent traffic issues. This work must be completed before the bridge replacement can occur.

We are still working with Harris County Precinct One, Commissioner Rodney Ellis on the location and timing for a new mobility bridge across the bayou. It looks like this hike/bike bridge will be constructed close the Glen Arbor by the exercise station. We'll keep you posted as we finalize the details.

### **Sidewalks:**

Working with the city and Metro, the BSN has been instrumental in getting new sidewalks on the western side of Stella Link near Latma. Metro is also installing new, ADA accessible bus stops along the area. We are very excited to see these improvements in the Stella Link corridor!

### **Linkwood Park:**

The new toddler playground area is open and being used! I encourage everyone to stop by the park and check it out. The playground equipment is state of the art stuff. Phase 2 of the park renovation will start soon. Stay tuned for more details!

### **Mayoral Candidate Forum:**

Residents of House District 134,

I have received multiple requests to address a post spread on facebook about Proposition 4, the constitutional amendment on this fall's ballot that will prohibit the imposition of a state income tax. On the ballot, it will read as follows:

Proposition 4 (HJR 38)

"The constitutional amendment prohibiting the imposition of an individual income tax, including a tax on an individual's share of partnership and unincorporated association income."

Voting FOR Proposition 4 confirms your opposition to a state income tax by constitutionally prohibiting it. Currently, the Texas Constitution prohibits an income tax from being imposed without the approval of a majority of Texans in a statewide election (Art 8, Sec. 24). If Proposition 4 passes, then the option to create a state income tax through the aforementioned process would no longer be available.

Voting AGAINST Proposition 4 leaves the possibility that the Texas Legislature could enact an income tax in the future with voter approval.

Throughout the coming months before this November's election, I will be speaking on Proposition 4 and the rest of the constitutional amendments at civic clubs across the district. ### Favorite hobby or thing to do as a family?


We take advantage of all that Knollwood has to offer. Being close to all the sporting and cultural events. Use the bayou almost every day to walk, run or work out.




