

President's Report

Dear Neighbors,

As we enter the second half of the year, I want to be candid about the financial state of our Civic Club. As of mid-July, **only 24% of households in Knollwood Village have paid their annual dues and security contributions.**

That means 474 homes have not yet contributed, **leaving us short of the funds we need to meet our 2025 budget.**

This matters. Our largest line item—by far—is SEAL Security patrols. These patrols help deter crime and give our residents peace of mind. But they're not guaranteed. Without broader participation in dues, we cannot afford the hours we have scheduled. We've already begun to scale back, and unless more households contribute soon, further cuts are coming.

Thank you to everyone who has already paid this year. If you have not

already done so, please submit your 2025 KVCC dues and security patrol contributions as soon as possible.

An Interview with Constable Smokie Phillips of Precinct 7

For this issue, we sat down for an interview with Constable Smokie Phillips of Precinct 7, who shares valuable insights on crime trends, scam prevention, and what we can all do to help keep Knollwood Village safe. One of his key messages is simple but powerful: neighborhoods are safest when people know each other and stay involved.

Being an active, connected neighbor—whether by joining the KVCC, reporting issues through 311, or just checking in on someone down the block—makes a real difference. I hope you enjoy learning a bit more about the Constable and Precinct 7.

311: A Powerful Resource

Many of the day-to-day concerns we hear about—missed trash pickups, overgrown yards, potholes, illegal dumping, abandoned items—can and should be reported directly to the City of Houston through 311. The system works, and it's a key part of keeping our neighborhood in good shape.

You can call 311, use the website, or download the Houston 311 app to submit requests and track their resolution. Whether it's a streetlight outage or a sidewalk obstruction, reporting it through 311 gets the issue on the city's radar and increases the chances of a timely fix.

Reminders

Going out of town? Submit a vacation watch with SEAL Security so they can keep an eye on your property while you're away.

Planning exterior work? Review the deed restrictions and submit your project to the Architectural Control Committee (ACC) before starting.

Constable James "Smokie" Phillips on Community & Safety

Precinct 7's Constable talks safety, scams, and staying involved

We spoke with Constable "Smokie" Phillips of Precinct 7 about public safety, community involvement, and what residents can do to keep neighborhoods like Knollwood Village safe. From crime trends to senior scams, he shared valuable insights every neighbor should know.

For neighbors who may not know you, please take a moment to introduce yourself and share a bit about your background.

Constable Phillips: My name is James Phillips, but everyone calls me "Smokie" Phillips. People often ask where the nickname came from. It began in elementary school when I played the trombone and piano. One day, the band director said, "Man, you're smoking!" — meaning I was doing great and playing a good tune. The name stuck throughout elementary, middle school, high school, college, and beyond.

I started my law enforcement career in 1983 under Constable A.D. Chambers, the first African American constable in Harris County Precinct 7. Since then, I've worked for the sheriff's office, returned to the constable's office, and spent 20 years under the leadership of Constable May Walker as a senior administrative captain. When she retired, I ran for office and won the March 5, 2024, Democratic Primary, then went on to win the General Election on November 5, 2024, with 90,100 votes.

I'm a graduate of the University of Houston Police Academy and a former student of the University of North Texas. I've accumulated thousands of training hours, served as president of the Afro-American Sheriff Deputy Union for 15 years, and worked in nearly every division, including patrol, warrants, civil process, and dispatch. I know how this office runs from the ground up. I've also earned a Texas Master Peace Officer Certification.

What do you find most meaningful about this work?

Constable Phillips: Helping people. Making a difference in the community, whether it's stopping crime, resolving disputes, or just offering a smile. Over the years, people have come back to share

stories — like the time I stopped to help them change a tire on the freeway or came by their house to talk with their teenager. It's those small things that matter most.

Can you tell us more about Precinct 7? What areas does it cover?

Constable Phillips: Precinct 7 covers about 94.7 square miles. We serve Midtown, Third Ward, Hiram Clarke, a small part of Meyerland, the Museum District, the Medical Center, parts of southwest Houston, and an area stretching from 45 South at Scott Street over to 69 and Murphy Road — the southern area of Harris County. We border Fort Bend and Brazoria Counties.

When I started in 1983, Precinct 7 had approximately 270,000 residents. We have become one of the fastest-growing precincts in terms of affordable housing and new commercial development. According to the U.S. Census, we now have a population of about 528,000. Precinct 7 was established in 1973, originally in Pasadena, Texas.

By then, the community had already seen the emergence of remarkable leaders. Constable Arthur Burtis "(A.B.)" Chambers was appointed the first constable of Precinct 7 and became the first African American constable in Harris County and in the state of Texas. Constable A.B. Chambers was more than a law enforcement officer — he was a pillar of the community, embodying integrity, dedication, and a deep understanding of the needs of Southeast Houston residents. His leadership helped shape the precinct into a symbol of trust and service.

His first chief clerk, Roberta Ewing, faced the same racism and bigotry that Constable Chambers endured. She met it with steadfast courage and continues to serve Precinct 7 today as chief clerk under both me and former Constable May Walker (retired).

What does your team do day-to-day, and how do you differ from HPD?

Constable Phillips: I maintain an open-door policy,

allowing any resident or community stakeholder to stop by and discuss matters. We handle patrols, community programs, traffic safety, and civil process service, which are among our primary duties.

We are elected officials, typically overseeing a specific precinct or district within a county. We have statewide authority as peace officers, meaning we can enforce laws anywhere in Texas, but our primary jurisdiction is within our precinct or county. We serve warrants and subpoenas, enforce eviction orders, assist in criminal investigations, and provide law enforcement services for justice courts — including court security.

The Houston Police Department (HPD) is a municipal police department serving the city of Houston. HPD enforces laws, maintains public order, and provides policing within the city limits. Their jurisdiction is confined to Houston, though they work in cooperation with other agencies. HPD focuses on patrol, criminal investigations, traffic enforcement, community policing, and emergency response.

As your Precinct 7 constable, I focus on community-oriented policing. For example, we have a program that regularly checks on seniors over 65. We also operate "Constables on Patrol," and we plan to establish a Constables' Academy to educate residents about our role. But at the end of the day, constables, sheriff's deputies, DPS troopers, and HPD officers are all considered peace officers of the state of Texas.

What are some of the main public safety concerns in neighborhoods like Knollwood Village?

Constable Phillips: In the past, when I was a field operations captain, we often got calls about speeding, minor disputes between neighbors or family members, and issues with unleashed animals. Those problems still arise today — especially pets off-leash and reports of suspicious vehicles or solicitors.

What advice do you have for residents about keeping the community safe?

Constable Phillips: Build strong connections with your neighbors. Share information and watch out for one another. If you see someone you don't recognize walking around, call your neighbors or call us.

Make sure your property is secure — good outdoor lighting, locked doors and windows, and an alarm system all help. Never leave valuables visible in your car, including garage door openers.

Community engagement is key. Start a neighborhood watch, attend civic club meetings, and stay informed.

Are there any crime trends people should be aware of?

Constable Phillips: Yes, there are several trends residents should know:

- Package thefts: People follow delivery trucks to grab packages off porches.
- Unlocked vehicles: Many people leave garage door openers, laptops, or valuables inside. Once a thief gains access to your garage, they can enter your home.
- Bicycle theft: Kids leave bikes out, and thieves take them.
- Senior scams: Scammers target seniors by phone, pretending to be law enforcement or offering fake trips. One suspect scammed 30 seniors by promising a trip to Atlanta for Black History Month.

Also, be careful with social media. Don't post when you're out of town — it lets everyone know your house is empty.

What advice can you share to help people avoid scams?

Constable Phillips: My biggest advice is — don't ever give out your personal information over the phone. No Social Security numbers, no banking info, no driver's license numbers.

If someone calls saying you've got a warrant or won a prize, hang up and contact us directly to verify. Scammers are becoming increasingly sophisticated, even using AI to mimic voices. Always double-check. If it sounds too good to be true — or if it sounds threatening — it probably is. Stay cautious, stay informed, and don't hesitate to call our office if you have any concerns.

If residents see something suspicious or need assistance, how can they reach you?

Constable Phillips: Our dispatch is available 24/7 at 713-643-6602. You can call us about any suspicious activity, welfare checks, or other concerns. In an emergency, always dial 911.

We also offer a program for individuals over 65, allowing them to sign up for regular check-in calls. If you don't answer, we'll contact your emergency contact or send a deputy to your home to make sure you're okay.

If you are a senior and would like to participate in the program, please call my office at 713-643-6118, Monday through Friday, 9:00 AM–4:00 PM, and ask for Ms. Jackie St-Julian-Duke. She is the "Are You Okay" coordinator. We will never ask for personal information, such as your Social Security number or driver's license.

If you could share one message in closing, what would you want the community to know?

Constable Phillips: "Get involved, be involved, and stay involved."

Attend civic club and community meetings, participate in neighborhood watch, and maintain

open communication with your neighbors. As neighbors, you can deter crime, respond quickly, and foster a sense of trust and solidarity.

I'm certainly not asking you to become a police officer in your community, and I don't want to put you or your family in danger. But when residents are safely engaged and proactive, it creates a safer, stronger community where everyone feels connected and invested in each other's well-being.



Treasurer's Report

Dear Neighbors,

The 2025 budget was approved earlier this year with total contributions budgeted at \$80,550 and projected expenses at \$77,387, leaving a modest net operating income of \$3,163. As always, the majority of our spending goes toward maintaining SEAL Security patrols, neighborhood beautification, and the basic operational needs of the Civic Club.

As of this writing, we have collected **\$47,362 in dues and security contributions, which represents just 24% of our 624 properties.**

That means 474 households have not yet contributed, and we still need 106 more homes to pay their dues in order to meet our annual budget and fully fund our planned SEAL security patrol hours.

If you haven't yet paid your dues for 2025, please consider doing so today. Your contribution of \$290 supports the services that help keep Knollwood Village safe, attractive, and well-managed.

Security Report

The Knollwood Village security incidents reported below are compiled from reports that residents make to S.E.A.L. Security Solutions (SEAL), crime data from the Houston Police Department that is available on the internet, and reports from residents. Information available on the crime data website is limited to the basic details of block number, date, time, and type of crime.

NOTE: PLEASE report all criminal incidents to both HPD and SEAL Security. This reporting redundancy is important. HPD allocates their patrol resources to areas that report incidents. It is to Knollwood Village's benefit to report all incidents that occur here to HPD so we can have additional HPD patrols. In addition, SEAL Security does not receive HPD reports so if SEAL is not informed our SEAL officer will not know what to be on the lookout for during patrols. Also, SEAL provides a detailed history of reported incidents to the KVCC and that record is one of the sources of information used to compile our quarterly newsletter report which helps keep residents informed about how the criminals operate so deterrent measures can be made more effective.

If you notice any persons in the neighborhood who are behaving suspiciously please call the Houston Police Department's non-emergency phone number, which is 713-884-3131, and report them. After you report the suspicious person(s) to HPD please call SEAL Security at 713-561-5757, and report the suspicious person(s) to them.

If, however, you see a crime in progress, such as a person breaking the window of a house or kicking in a door, then call 911, the City of Houston's emergency number, to report it.

Knollwood Village is in Precinct 7 of the Harris County Constable's office. The patrol dispatch number for the Precinct 7 Constable's office is 713-643-6602. The Houston Police Department should always be called first at their non-emergency number listed above, but feel free to call the Precinct 7 Constable second. If a Constable officer happens to be patrolling in the area they may be able to respond to a call more quickly than HPD officers patrolling further away.

If you notice any persons in the neighborhood who are behaving suspiciously please call the Houston Police Department's non-emergency phone number, which is 713-884-3131. After you report the suspicious person(s) to HPD please call SEAL Security at 713-561-5757, and report the suspicious person(s) to them. 
