

Esplanade Sign Update

Great News! On February 1, we started our fundraising effort to replace our existing neighborhood signs on Buffalo Speedway and S. Braeswood. We're excited to report that as of the time of printing of the newsletter (March 12) we have received contributions totaling over \$9,952-- see detailed breakdown below.

To achieve our goal, we still need approximately 130 homes to contribute \$50.



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

Yard Care & Fertilizer Schedule

January/February	Prune trees if excessive shade is a problem. Call Steve for tax tips for the new year.				
February 1	Pre-emergent weed-preventer for grassy weeds; fungicide for Brown Patch prevention.				
Feb/March	Post-emergent weed-killer for broadleaf weeds (apply when above 70 degrees in daytime).				
Sharpen lawnmower blade; mow lawn short (1.5 to 2 inches the first time ONLY while the lawn is dormant before spring green-up; catch clippings; apply 2nd appre-emergent weed preventer. Ideal time to list your home. Call Steve at 713 -					
April 15	Fertilize with fast-release 15-5-10 fertilizer (1 lb N per 1,000 sq. ft.) after second mowing (if lawn is very shady, decrease fertilizer amount by one-half; or wait until fall to fertilize); mow at 5- to 7-day intervals at a height of 3" (use a mulching blade, and drop clippings); begin watering 1" per week, April thru June. File your tax protest & call Steve for comps.				
May 15	Fertilize with slow-release 21-7-14 fertilizer (2 lbs N per 1,000 sq. ft.).				
May/June/July	Sod or plug St. Augustine; water daily for first week, then twice weekly.				
May/June/July De-thatch & core-aerate if required, while grass actively growing; apply ¼ inch of co					
June/July/Aug/Sept	Monitor for Chinch Bugs. Regular watering.

June/July/Aug	Monitor for Grub Worms and treat while still in the larval stage (usually in July and August); water no more than twice weekly (1 inch with each application).
Sept 15 – Oct 1	Pre-emergent weed-preventer for broadleaf weeds; decrease watering to 1" per week throughout the fall; monitor for sod web worms.
October 1	Apply fungicide for Brown Patch control when first cold front passes through (may be as early as August). Call for a list of quick, affordable improvements to add value.
October 15	Over-seed in sunny areas with rye grass, if desired. Tall Fescue seed in shady areas only.
November 1	Apply a "winterizer" fertilizer (a fast-release nitrogen also can be appropriate at this time); apply 2 nd application of fungicide for Brown Patch control; fertilize shady lawns if they have not been fertilized this year. Great time to find a safe, profitable investment property.
December 1	Second application of pre-emergent weed preventer.
Dec. – January	Use post-emergent weed-killer on actively growing broadleaf winter weeds before they begin to flower; do not apply any weed-killer once it begins to green-up in the spring.
Dec. — March	Water every 2 weeks if there is no rainfall (usually not required).

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KVCC Winter 2014 Security Report

Since the previous issue of the newsletter, incidents in Knoll-wood Village reported to Smith Security include eight burglaries of a residence or garage, two burglaries of sheds, two vehicle thefts, three incidents of vehicle being ransacked, and three reports of suspicious or unfamiliar vehicles. The vehicle thefts were the result of some of the burglaries, since access and keys to the vehicles were obtained through burglarizing the residences.

If you notice any persons in the neighborhood who are behaving suspiciously please IMMEDIATELY call the Houston Police Department's non-emergency phone number, which is 713-884-3131, and report them. After you report the suspicious person(s) to HPD, please call Smith Protective Services at 713-789-5944, and report the suspicious person(s) to them. It is important to call HPD and Smith because they both need to know what to watch out for.

If, however, you see a crime in progress, such as a person breaking the window of a house or kicking in a door, then call 911 which is the City of Houston's emergency number to report it.

Knollwood Village is in Precinct 7 of the Harris County Constable's office. The patrol dispatch number for the Precinct 7 Constable's office is 713-643-6602. The Houston Police Department should always be called first at their non-emergency number listed above, but feel free to call the Precinct 7 Constable's dispatch number second. If a Constable officer happens to be patrolling in the area they may be able to respond to a call more quickly than a HPD officer patrolling further away.

Knollwood Village Smith Reports (late November 2014 through February 2015)

3000 block Linkwood (11/18/14 11:32 AM) - Resident's vehicle was burglarized the previous evening. The vehicle may have been left unlocked. Items taken include tools, radio, and GPS system. Patrol advised resident to report the crime to HPD.

8400 block Hatton (12/8/14 8:36 AM) - Residence was burglarized the previous night. Rear window of house was broken to gain entry. Items taken include laptop computers, cell phones, electronic device, and a wallet and a purse both containing credit cards and cash. The purse was recovered later minus the cash it contained. Burglary was reported to HPD.

3100 block Prescott (12/10/14 8:52 AM) - HPD flagged down patrol and reported that a residence had been burglarized the previous night. The residence is close to, but not within the boundaries of Knollwood Village. The burglar gained entry through a rear door that may have been unlocked and took a wallet and a purse, a cell phone, and a set of car keys. The purse was found in the back yard minus the cash that was inside. The burglar used the keys to steal the resident's car which was later found abandoned on Stella Link near the South Loop.

2900 block Broadmead (12/11/14 3:00 PM) - Resident reported that at about 3:00 AM on 12/6/14 a burglar used the garage door opener found in their car to open the garage door part way. Over the next few hours the burglar returned to the garage multiple times to steal items. Items taken include two bicycles, a saw, lawn equipment, and shoes.

8200 block Hatton (12/12/14 10:00 AM) - Patrol noticed an unfamiliar car parked in the driveway of a residence. After patrol drove past, the car departed in a hurry. Patrol became suspicious after observing the way the car was driving through the neighborhood and reported the car to HPD. Patrol later found the car in the driveway and pulled in behind it. After speaking with the driver patrol learned they were new residents of the neighborhood.

8400 block Hatton (12/16/14) - Resident reported that during the previous month, on 11/15/14, two bicycles were stolen out of a storage building while they were working in the front yard. Patrol advised them to report the theft to HPD.

2900 block Ashwood (12/16/14) - On 12/13/14 a backyard storage shed was broken into and a number of tools were stolen. Patrol advised resident to report theft to HPD.

8500 block Bluegate (12/18/14 12:10 PM) - Dispatch reported that a resident was concerned about a car that they observed in the area. Patrol investigated and determined that the car belonged to someone visiting another resident.

7900 block Greenbush (12/23/14 10:41 AM) - During the previous night a thief jumped the fence on the side of the house and used remote control found in vehicle to open garage door. Resident's vehicle was stolen and found on Stella Link at 6:00 AM. The side of the vehicle was damaged when it was stolen.

Buffalo Speedway and Norris (1/2/15 11:48 AM) - Patrol assisted residents in rounding up a lost dog. The owners of the dog arrived to take it home.

3000 block Conway (1/6/14 10:42 AM) - Resident flagged down patrol and reported that their home had been burglarized on 12/31/14. The burglars broke into the rear of the house/garage and took a number of power tools and a generator. HPD was contacted.

3000 block Castlewood (1/12/15 8:16 AM) - Dispatch reported that a resident called to report an unfamiliar car parked in the driveway of a nearby home. Patrol investigated and learned that the car belonged to a man doing construction work on the house.

3100 block Linkwood (1/12/15 8:32 AM) - Between the hours of 2:00 AM and 8:00 AM on 1/10/15 a garage was broken into and a bicycle and various Craftsman tools were stolen.

3100 block Linkwood (1/12/15 8:53 AM) - Resident's car was ransacked between midnight and 2:00 AM on 1/10/15. A number of gift cards were taken. The theft was reported to the Precinct 7 Constable's office.

3000 block Stanton (1/28/15 9:18 AM) - On the previous night between midnight and 6:00 AM, the garage of residence was broken into and a number of items were stolen, including a power drill, sunglasses, and two GPS based electronic devices. The resident's vehicle also was stolen and then it apparently was returned to the residence after it had sustained significant damage to the rear portion of the vehicle.

3000 block Prescott (1/28/15) - Between midnight and 6:00 AM the previous night, house was burglarized while the residents were asleep. Numerous tools were taken from the garage and residents were trying to determine what else had been taken. HPD was called.

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

Bayou Greenway Day 2015

The featured bayou for this year is Brays Bayou!

Bayou Greenway Day 2015 is a project of the Houston Parks Board in collaboration with the Mayor's Office of Special Events and the Houston Parks and Recreation Department.

The overall plan is to extend the greenway all the way from the ship channel to the west beltway area. The Harris County Flood Control District is doing a massive flood control project along the bayou and work began on the eastern edge by the ship channel and has progressed westward to the Texas Medical Center. We can expect to see construction in our area within the next 6 - 12 months.

This event is a great way to see how the city parks department is creating a greenway along the bayou in conjunction with the flood control work.

Location

Four "hubs" – Fonde Park, Gragg Park, Spurlock Park, and Mason Park – will feature an array of fun activities for all ages in festival-like atmosphere.

These parks will serve as activity "hubs" from which families can venture out and explore the Brays Bayou Greenway.

Parking

Braeswood Super Neighborhood Update

A very informative meeting was held in January where the proposed senior living facility at Bethany United Methodist Church was discussed. An additional informational session was presented on February 24. As of the date this article was prepared, the project is on hold for approximately 12 months. The state of Texas and the city of Houston have different definitions for "supportive housing" and that has caused a delay in the application process by Bethany UMC. They are working with the state and will be resubmitting their application. The SN will be sending out notices on this project as we learn about steps being taken to further this project. The planning committee at Bethany UMC has promised to keep us posted as they work through the technical issues in their application.

We also have been following the progress of the work along Braes Bayou, part of the Project Brays being coordinated by the Harris County Flood Control District. We recently learned that channel modifications have been funded to continue the work all the way to Stella Link. Current work is funded to Buffalo Speedway. This work will increase the capacity of Braes Bayou to carry storm water, thereby reducing the risk of flooding.

It has been decided that the group will not hold monthly meetings but will switch to a bi-monthly schedule. The next meeting of the SN is scheduled for April 16. This is scheduled to be an informational session about education. Scheduled to speak are the trustees from both HISD as well as the Harris County Dept. of Education. Plus we will have information on any items concerning education from the current legislative session in Austin. The meeting will be held at Linkwood Park starting at 6:30 pm.

It's Time to Get Out to the Park!





The fence structure will be similar to the fence surrounding Karl Young Park which protects the park's youngest patrons from high traffic roads. Similar to Karl Young, Linkwood Park is surrounded by busy streets. Two years ago a child was involved in a serious

accident when crossing Ilona to Linkwood Park. Adding low fencing along Ilona and Norris will not only provide a secure barrier for playground activity, it will help prevent popular park toys like soccer balls, and more importantly the children who play with them, from easily entering the street. This project will be funded by the Service Budget Request funds awarded to Linkwood Park at the request of Council Member Larry Green. Friends of Linkwood Park is grateful to have the support of District K through its knowledgeable, "pro-parks" leadership team.


