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A Message From Your KVCC President

Hi Neighbors,

It looks like we made it through another hot summer, as well as some monsoon-type storms. Hopefully, the temps continue to stay down, the occasional rain continues and the hurricanes stay far, far away.

We recently held our second and final resident's meeting of the year on September 8th. I want to especially thank those that made it a priority to come out and support the Civic Club; we had a very good showing. Those present were able to hear an excellent presentation by the Harris County Flood Control District on Project Brays. You can review the presentation slides on our website. We also spent a good portion of the meeting reviewing esplanade beautification proposals, designs and cost estimates. In general, the majority of residents present favored additional beautification efforts of our esplanades. Feedback and options will be further researched, deliberated and discussed by the Beautification Committee, as well as the KVCC Board before any final decisions are made. Additional residents are welcome to join this committee to participate in future decisions.

Here are some additional brief updates that you may be interested in since the last newsletter:

Financially, we are short dues collection from about 40 homes to match our totals from last year and ideally, we always like to have a modest improvement. If you are new to the neighborhood or aren't sure if you paid yet, you will find a list in the newsletter for you to check. If it's slipped your mind, please get us your payment in whatever way is most convenient to you.

Volunteers – We had a few residents at the resident's meeting come forward that appear to be willing to help us in some areas in need which is fantastic. What's

your passion or your expertise and do you have a little free time to offer to the Civic Club? We still need some help with our Welcoming Committee and we encourage some new faces to consider participating with our board the rest of this year for roles to be determined in 2016.

Linkwood Overlay - Linkwood Dr (west of Buffalo Speedway) finally received their overlay. Initially, the City Public works and Engineering folks said the street was in too poor of shape for an overlay, but it was re-evaluated after some residents brought it up at the annual Capital Improvement Projects (CIP) meeting. Linkwood Drive, as well as all other Knollwood Village streets west of Buffalo Speedway, is currently part of a CIP project scheduled in 2019 for new streets, sidewalks, drainage and lighting. It's always subject to change when it's that far out but it's something to look forward to. As for the remaining streets on the east side, we are currently not in the 10 year plans. For those on the west side, we may consider offering residents a payment program beginning next year to put money down towards upgraded lighting as the costs will likely be in the \$600-\$700 range per resident (based on past participation and experience). For now, I just wanted to give those residents something to think about.

Young Live Oaks Trees on South Braeswood – We recently had the 26 young Live Oak trees on S. Braeswood evaluated and some maintenance performed. As it turns out, the cabling supports initially applied when the trees were planted were choking fourteen (14) of the trees. Twelve (12) of the trees had their supports removed (no longer needed) and 3 dead trees were removed (these died when initially planted and were missed when others were replaced).

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KVCC Summer 2015 Security Report

Since the previous issue of the newsletter in mid-June a number of incidents have been reported to Smith Security. There were two incidents of vandalism, some unusual/suspicious behavior reports, a home burglary, a robbery of a construction worker, a vehicle break-in, and a theft of yard equipment. The thief who took the lawn equipment was riding in a vehicle that had temporary paper license tags.

Knollwood Village residents should be aware that HPD has informed us that criminals sometimes drive vehicles with temporary paper license tags because they are difficult to read from a distance and they are easy to forge. If you observe unfamiliar vehicles in the neighborhood bearing temporary paper license plates please give them extra scrutiny.

If you notice any persons in the neighborhood who are behaving suspiciously please IMMEDIATELY call the Houston Police Department's non-emergency phone number, which is 713-884-3131, and report them. After you report the suspicious person(s) to HPD please call Smith Protective Services at 713-789-5944, and report the suspicious person(s) to them. It is important to call HPD and Smith because they both need to know what to watch out for.

If, however, you see a crime in progress, such as a person breaking the window of a house or kicking in a door, then call 911 which is the City of Houston's emergency number to report it.

Knollwood Village is in Precinct 7 of the Harris County Constable's office. The patrol dispatch number for the Precinct 7 Constable's office is 713-643-6602. The Houston Police Department should always be called first at their non-emergency number listed above, but feel free to call the Precinct 7 Constable's dispatch number second. If a Constable officer happens to be patrolling in the area they may be able to respond to a call more quickly than a HPD officer patrolling further away.

Knollwood Village Smith Reports (Mid-June 2015 through Mid-September 2015)

8900 block Bevlyn (6/2015 9:46 AM) - Resident stopped Patrol and reported that a window on their house (3500 block Deal) had been shot with a BB gun on night of 6/12/15 and they also reported that on the same evening a resident in the 8900 block of Bevlyn had a window on their vehicle shot with a BB gun. Patrol asked residents to report the damage to HPD.

3000 block Conway (7/4/15 daytime) - Resident glanced at their front door and noticed an unknown man peering through the glass. The resident called HPD to report the suspicious behavior.

8400 block Bluegate (7/5/15 daytime) - A resident was concerned about a man walking on the street who asked the resident for a ride. The resident left the area and called HPD to report the suspicious person.

8800 block Bevlyn (7/7/15 3:48 PM) - Patrol dispatched to home that had been burglarized. Resident was waiting for HPD when patrol arrived. The resident's alarm company called reporting that the alarm had been triggered. The front door was damaged during the break-in and jewelry and video games had been taken by the burglar.

3000 block Stanton (8/5/15 9:59 AM) - Dispatch reported that a worker at a home construction site was robbed at gunpoint. The victim was working on the back porch of the home when a black male brandishing a small silver gun approached and demanded the victim's wallet and cell phone. The robber took \$20 and a cell phone and was last seen walking on Stanton at Greenbush. HPD was called and a report was made.

8000 block Greenbush (8/11/15 9:36 AM) - A resident called to report that they observed a person lying on the street by the curb. Patrol investigated and learned that the person had been asked to leave a nearby house. Patrol suggested to the person that they call HPD for assistance if they were unable to resolve their problem.

3500 block Linkwood (8/12/15 9:00 AM) - A Knollwood Village resident flagged down Patrol and said that their vehicle had been broken into while parked in the church parking lot. A church employee observed the theft, but could not see the perpetrator because the thief was wearing a hood. Glass on the right front of the vehicle was broken and cash, credit cards, and a driver's license were taken. Also stolen were a laptop computer and two hard drives. A report was made to HPD.

3000 block Tilden (8/26/15 1:35 PM) - Two commercial gas lawn blowers were stolen from a yard crew at 11:12 AM. A nearby surveillance camera caught footage of the crime. The thief was a black male, estimated to be five to six feet tall and 210 to 220 pounds, and he was wearing dark clothing. The perpetrator was riding in the passenger side of a gray or silver Honda with paper license plates.

Longfellow Elementary, our local elementary school, recently achieved the distinguished **Lighthouse School status** among Leader in Me Schools. Out of nearly 2,000 Leader in Me Schools across the nation Longfellow became **one of only 150 schools to reach Lighthouse status**. Braeswood Super Neighborhood Meeting

October 15, 2015 Linkwood Park Community Room 6:30 – 8:00 pm.

Gary Zika, HCFCD Project Brays Program Manager, will update us on Project Brays and present information gathered about the Memorial Day flood. If you attended the KVCC September general meeting, you had an opportunity to meet Imelda Diaz from the HCFCD. This presentation at the BSN will be more detailed than what we had at our general meeting. Come with your questions regarding the flood control work that is being done along Braes Bayou!

The last storm basin to be constructed in the Project Braes Program is the Willow Water Hole and is the basin that is closest to our neighborhood. This detention basin is located off of S. Post Oak near US 90 (S. Main). Approximately 31% complete now, it is designed to hold approximately 600 million gallons of water during heavy rainfall. Several groups, including the city parks department, have partnered with HCFCD and are creating The Willow Waterhole Park. There have already been concerts in the park and trails are available for both hiking and biking.



10 Ways to Make Burglars Go Elsewhere

Special thanks to Realtor, Steve Anton for writing this article.

It would be great if the right doormat kept your home safe. Nothing can strip away the peace and comfort of your home quicker than a burglary. The financial and emotional toll is awful — and likely avoidable if you focus on the 3 D's: Deter, Detect and Delay.

- 1. **Meet your neighbors** and build a relationship with them. Having neighbors you can trust is like being home all the time. Give them your spare key instead of hiding it on the porch. Tell them when you are leaving town, don't tell Facebook. Encourage each other to report ANY person or vehicle or activity that seems unusual. Our deputies are delighted to stop and question suspicious persons. This is how crimes are prevented and solved.
- 2. **Fix your broken doorbell.** Burglars often ring the bell and if no one answers, they are coming in. They avoid occupied houses
- 3. **Button your lip.** Don't talk about your upcoming trip on Face-book or with the yardman or your housekeeper's nephew with a small drug problem. And wait to post your photos until you return.
- 4. **Don't leave notes** or a key for workmen or delivery services. Burglars can read, and they can read between the lines. From the street, a note looks like the all-clear sign to thieves.

- 5. **Install a first-class, monitored alarm system** with yard signs, a loud siren, glass-break sensors, door & window contacts and a wireless dialer in case your phone and power lines are cut. And USE IT. Highly visible surveillance cameras are a huge deterrent.
- 6. **Install exterior flood lights** on all 4 sides of your home. Timers and motion detectors are great but the key is MORE LIGHT. On the interior, use lamps on timers all day long, not just at night.
- 7. **If you have a dog door,** use a double-sided, keyed deadbolt so a long-armed burglar can't just reach through and unlock the door.
- 8. **Harden the target** stronger exterior doors with expensive dead-bolts and heavy-duty strike plates. Two locks on every window.
- 9. **Don't leave town** without contacting Smith Security so that you can use their Vacation Watch service which provides a lot more attention to your home during their regular patrols.
- 10. See your house the way a burglar does. They look for toys in the yard and signs of a busy, distracted family coming and going on a fixed schedule. Bring in the toys, as well as the paper and the mail as soon as it arrives and the trash can soon after pick-up. Keep your garage door closed. Thieves are patient, and they watch for patterns.
