Hello Neighbors,

I hope you and your loved ones had a great Thanksgiving and are looking forward to a festive December holiday.

For your Knollwood Village Civic Club Board, this is the time of year we report to you the status of our club's finances, security and projects. While the year has overall been somewhat uneventful, that usually is a good thing.

Some of this year's accomplishments include:

- An organized 60th anniversary event celebrating the existence of the neighborhood
- Successful completion of the street reconstruction/ upgraded streetlight project (for those on affected streets)
- Meaningful negotiation with Harris County Sports & Convention Corporation and Reliant Park to limit noise during outdoor events on the west side of Kirby
- Increased newsletter issues from 3 to 4 (1 a quarter)
- Addition of some new faces to our Civic Club board and committees
- Continued improvements in being more efficient in our committees and how we do things

Some areas where we are continually challenged include:

- It appears we are going to fall about \$2,000 short on dues collected vs. 2012.
- Inability to get city support to replace all remaining street/sewer infrastructure in the neighborhood and on Buffalo Speedway (from S. Braeswood to Main St.). We aren't even in the 10-year plan ...
- Slow progress with replacing our esplanade signage due to city permitting challenges
- Slow progress with adding sprinklers to the esplanades (on hold until esplanade signs updated)
- Replacement of trees planned on S. Braeswood during its street reconstruction

Civic Club Annual Meeting

We will be conducting the annual meeting of the Knollwood Village Civic Club on Tuesday, January 21, 2014, 6:30-8:30pm at Bethany Church, 3511 Linkwood, Classroom 42/43 (in back of church).

Drinks/snacks will be offered and our guest speaker will be **District K Council Member Larry Green**. CM Green will give an overview of District K initiatives during his first term, followed with Braeswood Super Neighborhood initiatives planned and programmed for the area. The floor will then open to Q&A, including questions relating to another possible attempt at creating an area management district. **Please come out to listen and be heard!**

An important agenda item required at the annual meeting is the election of officers for the club. Each officer is elected to serve a one-year term or until their successors are elected. The duties of each officer are detailed in the bylaws of the club, which are posted on the website under the Board and Officers resource link. We have summarized those duties below:

- President: Presides at all meetings; enforces the Articles of Incorporation and the bylaws; decides questions of procedure and order; and exercises supervision of the club affairs.
- Vice-President: Assists the president as needed and occupies the chair in the absence of the president; a member of the board or directors and also of the finance committee.
- Secretary: Keeps true and correct records of club proceedings; conducts correspondence as directed by the board; takes minutes of club and board of director meetings.
- Treasurer: Receives all dues for the club; reports the financial status of the club at all club meetings; is a member of the finance committee.

All officers currently in these positions are expected to continue unless opposed by other candidates—we encourage nominations from the floor!



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KVCC Fall 2013 Smith Security Incident Report

Since the last incident report in August there have been five home burglaries; four thefts from a garage, yard, or car; one robbery; one vehicle theft (subsequently recovered); and one incident of bullying.

If you notice any persons in the neighborhood who are behaving suspiciously, **please** call the Houston Police Department's non-emergency phone number, which is 713-884-3131, and report them. After you report the suspicious person(s) to HPD, please call Smith Protective Services at 713-789-5944 and report the suspicious person(s) to them. It is important to call HPD and Smith because they both need to know what to watch out for.

If you see a crime in progress, however, such as a person breaking the window of a house or kicking in a door, then call 911, the City of Houston's emergency number.

Knollwood Village Incident Reports (late August through November 2013)

3000 block Deal (8/29/13 9:03 AM) - Resident called Smith to report two suspicious males walking down the street. Upon arrival patrol asked a man walking his dog if he had seen anything. The only persons the man had observed were two mail carriers.

3400 block Gannett (9/1/13 AM) - Resident reported that a car was parked in the driveway of a neighbor who was out of town. Patrol checked with nearby residents and found the owner, who then moved the car from the driveway.

The passenger stepped out and asked the resident if they would like their grass cut. The resident said no and the men left. The resident felt threatened by the men and called Smith to report them.

3400 block Gannett (9/10/13 9:14 AM) - Resident called to report that a person had opened their garage door part way between 6:00 AM and 6:15 AM. When the resident woke up and observed this, they noticed two people walking very fast toward Buffalo Speedway. Resident called HPD. Nothing was taken.

3000 block Tilden (9/10/13 10:16 AM) - Resident reported that at 1:50 PM on 9/7/13, a friend of theirs who was

visiting parked their car in the driveway. When the friend opened the car door, two white or Hispanic males wearing black bandanas pulled the visitor from the car and took their purse. As the perpetrators ran to the street, they fired a gun in the air, then fled in a silver Lexus with paper license tags. No one was hurt. HPD was called.

2800 block Stanton (9/11/13 12:14 PM) - Resident reported that a suspicious person had rung their doorbell. The resident did not answer and called Smith Security. On arrival, patrol found a package on the porch. Apparently, UPS had delivered the package to the wrong address and the neighbor who had mistakenly received it had left it on the resident's porch.

3400 block Norris (9/13/13 8:47 AM) - Resident reported to patrol that their house had been burglarized on 9/4/13 sometime between 1:00 PM and 6:00 PM when the housekeeper called the homeowner to report the crime. The glass in the back door of the house was broken. Among the items stolen were watches, a purse, jewelry, cash, and cameras. HPD was notified.

had been taken from inside the house. A neighbor across the street noticed a pickup truck parked in the driveway of the burglarized home, but thought it was the homeowner's truck.



3500 block Deal (11/4/13 12:20 PM) - Home was burglarized. The burglar jumped over the fence into back yard, broke out the rear window of the house and took a flat screen TV and a DVD player. HPD was called.

3400 block Tilden (11/4/13 12:20 PM) - Homeowner reported two trucks parked in the street and reported that men from the trucks had walked around to the back of the houses. Patrol reported that the men were taking measurements and preparing one of the houses for demolition.

3000 block Tilden (11/21/13 9:07 AM) - About 30 sheets of plywood were stolen the previous day from a house under construction. Resident reported seeing a black Ford truck parked in the driveway of the house under construction and wrote down the license plate. Patrol advised the resident to call HPD.

Holiday Security Tips

With the holiday season coming up, a few precautions can decrease the chance that your home becomes the target of burglars. The tips provided have been collected from a number of sources, including conversations with HPD crime investigators, our neighborhood Smith Protective Services patrol officer, and the HPD website.

If you are leaving town, take steps to make your home appear lived in while you're gone. Mow the lawn and trim the hedges before you leave. Temporarily stop delivery of your mail and newspapers while you're gone. Plug a few lamps into wall outlet timers so they come on after dark. Inexpensive lamp timers are available at home improvement stores. Some timers can randomly vary the times they switch on and off. Leave a car parked in the driveway.

Your neighbors can be a valuable resource in helping to minimize the chances that your home may become a target for burglary. Let your neighbors know you'll be gone so they can keep an eye out. Give your neighbors contact information so they can let you know if there is a problem. Ask them to pick up any flyers or packages that might be left on the front porch, and if you don't want to stop the paper or mail ask if they would pick them up for you. If you don't have a car that can be left in the driveway while you're gone, you might ask your neighbor to park in your driveway.

Try not to have your holiday packages on display in front of a window. Don't make it easy for people to "shop your house" while driving by!

When parking, roll up the windows, lock the vehicle, take the keys, and ensure your valuables are concealed (preferably in the trunk). Better yet, take them inside your house!

Smith Protective Services can help keep your home secure while you are away. As part of the services Smith provides to Knollwood Village, you can call Smith at 713-789-5944 to let them know you'll be out of town. The security patrol will keep a closer eye on your house while you're away.

Some examples of things the security patrol has done in the past for residents who were gone include returning forgotten trash barrels to the house, picking up accumulated newspapers from the yard when delivery did not stop, shutting off water when pipes have burst, and closing open gates and garage doors.
